**E-Newsletter:** Talking about Local Content in engineering practice, what would you say about the participation of engineers in Local Content in Nigeria?

Engr. Chris Okoye: Local Content is a very important tool for reclaiming the practice of engineering for engineers in Nigeria. I am not quite sure that there is any tool that is as powerful like what we now call Local Content Act or the Nigerian Content Act. The problems of course we have, is how that Act is going to be implemented or what we call the clauses in the Act and also to be monitored so that it can achieve its purpose for which the law was enacted. The amount of incoming revenue in Nigeria would be much better because we also remember that the Local Content Act or the Nigerian Content Act talks about value addition, it talks about competencies, it talks about capacities, it talks about

capabilities, and all these are the things that are relevant for the sustainability in the practice of engineering in any country. I believe that in the past the Nigerian Society of Engineers was not as active as it should have been. It should have been the driver of these processes. I think they stayed on the side and allowed other institutions to do that when indeed they are the greatest beneficiary in the law. So I hope that they are now beginning to key in. We are now beginning to play our rightful role and I hope that with that platform that we have created we can now put all those things right on their crest and be able to deliver successfully for the benefit of the engineers and of course Nigeria as a whole.
