Interview with Engr. Nuruddeen Rafindadi, President of ACEN

Engr. Nuruddeen Rafindadi is the CEO of Afric-Projects Consortium. He is presently the president of Association of Consulting Engineers in Nigeria (ACEN).

E-Newsletter: What is ACEN and what does ACEN standards for?

Engr. Rafindadi: ACEN is the Association of Nigerian Consulting Engineers. It is an association for which

the members are Nigerian engineering consultancy firms, not individual engineers but firms that are duly licensed and registered to practice consultancy in Nigeria. These are the people that come together and form ACEN. ACEN was originally formed in 1972, so it is about forty (40) years old now. ACEN is a member of the International Federation of Consulting Engineers which is FIDIC. It is representing Nigeria in FIDC. It consists of all the top class consultancy firms that are registered by Council for the Regulation of Engineering in Nigeria (COREN).

E-Newsletter: What are the prerequisite for becoming an ACEN member? Is it open to all engineers or they have to meet certain requirements?

Engr. Rafindadi: It is simple. It is open to every engineering firm E-Newsletter: Thank you very much sir.

that is duly licensed, registered by COREN and practice consultancy engineering. It's really that simple but you know by law, you need to be enlightened by COREN in order to practice consultancy engineering. The law does not require you to be a member of ACEN but ACEN is a strong influence in COREN. As soon as you are registered in COREN as a firm, you are legible to be a member of ACEN.

E-Newsletter: What advice do you have for engineers who are not licensed/registered to consult but are consulting?

Engr. Rafindadi: I will advice them to be licensed/registered so that they can be at the right side of the law. According to Nigerian law today, it is not legal for you to practice engineering if you are not registered by COREN. You will find it more and more difficult if you are not registered by COREN because moving forward, most public organization will not give you consultancy job if you are not duly registered with COREN. Even when you do have the job, somewhere along the line, you might find it difficult if you are not registered and you will find yourself running back to COREN. Registration with COREN is also not difficult, so long as the partnership of the firm consist of members that are registered by COREN and the firm is registered with Cooperate Affairs Commission and the firm has an office, engineering staff, they have the necessary facilities in their office like software and probably they also have some live projects in their record, then they can registered with COREN.
