Interview with Engr. Gbemisi Akperi, FNSE, Vice President of COREN

Engr. Akperi: COREN, has a lot to do in so many areas. One of the challenges for COREN is effective regulation and control of the profession. A lot had been done to increase the strength and presence in various centers of the Engineering Regulation Monitoring (ERM). In the area of dealing with training in other cadres, COREN is looking at the technical colleges. We went round like was mention during the last Assembly; all the technical colleges we saw had no facilities. We are focusing on that, to improve the training of craftsmen and technicians from our technical colleges. We are also looking at the harmony in the engineering family and that was the focus of the 22nd Engineering Assembly. We just introduced that. We also want to ensure

that engineers in this country produce quality works and haven done that, they should be rewarded generously for what they have

E-Newsletter: What do you have to say to the young engineers? How do you think COREN can assist the young engineers to enter into the profession and the labour market?

Engr. Akperi: Most of the speakers at the 22nd Engineering Assembly directed their speeches at changing the focus of the young ones who are coming into the engineering profession. There are opportunities in the profession that people are not focusing on and an example is entrepreneurship. Engineers are skilled people and a skilled person who has entrepreneurial skill can reach a great level. We are not just talking about employment. If we have people with knowledge that have skills in an entrepreneurship, they can create jobs, they can create products and they can create market. That should be the focus for the young people. We need to do that by looking at their institutions where they are trained, give them quality training so that they can focus on creating employment for themselves. That is what we are doing.
