Interview with Dr. Idika Ochaa on Telecoms

Dr. Idika Ochaa, is the pioneer Director of Digital Bridge Institute, established by the Nigerian Communications Commission. He is the author of "The Making of Nigerian Tele-com Industry".

E-Newsletter: *What can you tell us about* Telecommunication Industry in Nigeria?

Dr. Ochaa: Well, Nigerian Telecom Industry is known to be the fastest growing telecom market in Africa and also one of the most competitive, if not absolutely most competitive in Africa. It has grown in leaps and bounds.

E-Newsletter: A re there challenges in the telecoms industry?

E-Newsletter: In what area do you think those challenges can be *improved on?*

Dr. Ochaa: I guess the most compelling challenge that the industry has been contending with is electricity power supply that powers telecommunication sites across the country. That is one of the greatest challenges that the industry faces. There are also issues of multiple taxation. Various tiers of government demand taxes and levies and there is no end

to it. This is not something you can actually sit down and have a budget for the year and say that I have predetermined my levy and tax obligation to the various tiers of government. Some of the levies imposed on telecoms infrastructures across the country are actually creative levies and there is a feelings that the telecoms mast for example is a tree where money grows and so all these authorizes comes to shake the tree to see how much money will fall from the tree. It is a big challenge for the telecoms industry.

E-Newsletter: How do you think the telecom industry can improve on service delivery?

Dr. Ochaa: Well, there are three or four different theories to the telecoms problems. There are those who believe that the problems are as a result of network congestion, there is another set of people who believe Dr. Ochaa: The challenges are there and I guess they are well that sloppy network design should be replaced and there is even the third category of opinion that put the blame on the handsets. There are elements of truth in all these, so we must take them together. Congestion occurs when there is inadequate capacity.
