These include attending to enquirpreparation of periodic reports, organization of Fellowship conferment ceremonies, general advice to the Management on Fellowship matters, etc and any other duties that may be assigned by **E-Newsletter:** Can you share your highpoints so far? the Executive Secretary.

E-Newsletter: How have you been able to manage these activities, especially in the area of according recognition to Fellows?

Mr. Mark: It has been widely acclaimed that Fellows ought to be accorded some distinction in all its ramifications and this is the NSE. Again, the Society stands to benefit a lot from their dis-distinguished members of the Society. positions and wealth of experience. In pursuance of these, we have created an online real-time virtual platform for Fellows to interact via the internet 24/7, to discuss national issues with a view to proffer solutions from the Engineering perspective.

E-Newsletter: What is the percentage of Fellows from the entire membership of NSE?

Mr. Mark: At present, the NSE has a total of about 34,329 members out of which 1,749 are Fellows. This represents about 5% of the entire membership. The Society also has 18 Honourary Fellows who are non-Engineers.

E-Newsletter: Are there any Challenges so far?

Mr. Mark: No major one so far. Apart from the fact that the office space allocated to the unit is yet to be equipped but the management is really doing something in that direction. 


World Congress on **Engineering Education**

E-Newsletter: You received a Presidential Award during the WECSI2014. What do you think qualified you for the award and how did you feel about it?

You know when you do things the best way you can, you may never know how others value it until you are called upon for recognition. Also, I see the award as a great challenge because when such an overt acknowledgement is made before all stakeholders (members and staff) of the society, it becomes a call to work hard, in order to maintain the rating.

E-Newsletter: Permit us to be a bit personal now. As a non-Engineer, how do you feel working with Engineers?

Mr. Mark: By virtue of this job, most of us at the Secretariat have somehow been integrated into the Engineering family, to the extent that I have been at times erroneously or humorously addressed as 'Engr.
