Interview with Dr. Jimson Olufuye

Dr. Jimson Olufuye, is the Chair of the Africa ICT Alliance (AfICTA).

E-Newsletter: What is AfICTA?

Jimson: The African ICT Alliance (AFICTA) is simply an organization led by the private sector in the ICT industry in Africa. Right now we have about twenty African countries represented in the organization. We started in 2012 in Lagos, Nigeria. We had the first summit Dr. Jimson Olufuye in 2013 in Lagos, the second in 2014 in



Cairo, Egypt and the third one is coming up in September 2015 in Johannesburg. Our goal is simply to fulfill the promise of the digital age for everyone in Africa. The promise of the digital age is ensuring that every citizen of Africa benefits from the dividend of the information revolution. We provide platforms for professionals to hear their voices across Africa. We speak at the United Nations

especially the United Nations Commission for Science and Technology Development, first on improvement to internet governance forum and also on enhanced corporation for public matters pertaining to the internet. So we have been actively involved in these working groups in the United Nations. We also play active role in ICANN (Internet Corporation for Assigned Names and Numbers) where I am the Vice Chair of Finance and Operation of the Business Constituency of ICANN. We are actively engaged at the international space and within the African space we collaborate with United Nations Economic Commission for Africa and with the African Unon and with other ICT associations. We hope to continue expanding and cover up to the 54 nations in Africa. Our vision is very clear, provide opportunities for job creation for all Africans, exchange of best practices, promoting trade within ourselves and ensuring that the dividend of the digital age does not elude Africa. The dividend of the agricultural revolution eluded us and that of the industrial revolution also eluded us but we don't want that of the digital revolution to elude us also.
