Interview with Dr. Chris Uwaje

Dr. Chris Uwaje is known as the Oracle of the Nigeria Information Technology industry. He pioneered the conceptualization framework and content drafting strategy for the establishment of the National Information Technology Development Policy for Nigeria. Uwaje is the IEEE Chair for Publicity & Communications for Africa for the World Forum on Internet of Things 2016.

E-Newsletter: Sir, we have heard of Internet of Things and now you have come up with the concept of Internet of the Mind. What is it about?

Uwaje: It comes in from the fact that it is practically impossible for the mind to think about nothing and the internet of things comes from the mechanism of thought processes called the dynamism of information reasoning that is the logic sequence and concept that creates the concept, the process and the product at the same time. So the Internet of the Mind is really where we are living in at the moment which is the root level of the internet of things. There was nothing new about emails in those days but then research and development took us to the world of connectivity, emailing and others. Really it is not about the e-mail, it is not about the minds that are thinking about them at that point in time.

How did our fore fathers think about striking two stones to make fire, it was the thinking out of the box that made it happen. The internet of mind is when you sit down to research and develop, to do innovations, to do inventions and to be able to spur technology into another direction which is the incarnate of the mind that is thinking. When Mark Zuckerberg created Facebook there was no Facebook but his mind created Facebook to put on the internet. So you don't see the internet before the mind you see mind before the internet the mind makes the internet happen, the mind makes the content happen. eBay and Google are people's mind that you see at play. The mind is a creator, the mind is an innovator. Those processes of the mind is what we need to imbibe in our children, for the youths to use the mind to reconstruct the society, to use the mind to reconstruct education, to use the mind to reconstruct peace as an architecture of living in an environment because if you don't think about architecture of peace you will have crisis. These things should be sustainable, you have to make them diffuse and radiate into the primary schools and the secondary schools. If Nigeria or Africa is not on the table of the internet of minds and on the table of the internet of things using African software of things we will be left behind.
