**E-Newsletter**: Sir, can you tell us what FIDIC is about?

FIDIC President: FIDIC stands for the French acronym of International Federation of Consulting Engineers. FIDIC has eighty-six countries that are members of FIDIC. ACEN; Association of Consulting Engineers Nigeria is a FIDIC member from Nigeria and only one association is admitted per country. We don't have two associations from one country and also that association must represent companies. So it is like a business association, not individual members. There are no individual members of FIDIC. We represent the business interest of our member firms, for our member associations. FIDIC was founded in 1913. It started in Europe; Belgium and France and today we have the headquarters of FIDIC in Geneva, Switzerland. FIDIC really is the global voice of design the built environment. FIDIC President: It has faired very well. If you look at the fact that

it started with just a few countries in Europe getting together and today we have eighty-six (86) countries. The FIDIC name is a very powerful brand name in the engineering and construction industry worldwide. Everywhere I have travelled to and I have travelled to many countries, FIDIC is the premier organisation that represents engineering and engineering consultants. So it has faired very well. FIDIC is doing very well; it is highly regarded, it is highly esteemed by government in Asia, in the Middle-East, in Europe and Africa. So it has done extremely well.

E-Newsletter: What word of advice do you have for FIDIC member countries and consulting engineering firms that are registered with ACEN?

**FIDIC President:** Yes, I have two words. The government needs to be more supportive of local companies. There are capabilities; you have the talent, you have the expectations but for some reasons Nigerian firms are not involved at prime and major projects. In fact I don't think they involve them all. So the government needs to start building a sustainable engineering industry locally. From the government side, awarding contracts and design contracts should be given to local companies and also companies should be paid on time. I heard that sometimes companies work for several months and they don't get paid; you can't have a sustainable business if you don't get paid. So that's my word for the clients and government of the public sector. For the companies, I have told them myself; the few things I will urge them to do is; pay attention to the quality of work they do, it is very important. They have to do quality work. Secondly they need to grow bigger. Companies in Nigeria are not big and that might be impeding their ability to do big projects. You engineering consultants representing the global interest of engineers that need to have companies that can grow in size to several hundreds and






#### Felicitation
