E-Newsletter: Sir, you have spent quite some time in the Ministry of Power, how was the power generation in the past, how is it now and how will it be in the future with regards to Rivers State and Nigeria at large?

about Rivers State but not much about Nigeria, because I do not has some social-service element in it because usually it is not know much about what they are doing at the Federal level (*sic*.). In Rivers State, we are conscious of the need to give power to our people because with power, we feel the people will be empowered. Like we say in the Ministry, we have a firm belief in the those who cannot pay. That means, some social services in some "Power of Power to Empower the People". We have identified respect. So the privatisation is a step to implement that programme and also improve on it. With the in the right direction and I believe that confidently. 350MW facility that he left on ground, it is only about 100MW of it that was commissioned. We have increased the capacity to 720 E-Newsletter: Thank you. MW with close to 500MW commissioned and by the end of next year, we will be having 720MW of generation. We are building transmission lines all the way from Omoku to Port Harcourt; from Afam to Port Harcourt, and from Afam to Eleme, through to Onne. All of these come together to give us a robust backbone in transmission. As you may be aware of, we have also done substa-

tions at High Voltage and Medium Voltage levels. We have 132/33KVA substation at Elelenwo and at Rumuosi and we are building one at Trans Amadi. We have 28 injection substations at 33KVA and 11KVA levels. All these we have done within our administration and they are all aimed at stabilising power for our people so that they can do their businesses in a more powerfriendly environment and live life that is enjoyable.

E-Newsletter: How do you see the new exercise of privatisation in Rivers State and Nigeria at large?

Hon. Wokocha: I think privatisation is the way to go and power, the way it is run in Nigeria is not as business(sic.). Power everybody you give power to that has the capacity to pay for the cost of power that gets to him or her. Usually, what we do in the power sector is, have those who can pay and we augment for vestors, we have the firm belief that they will do a better job.
