Interview with Prof. Luca Luiselli

Prof. Luca Luiselli is a Professor in the University of Rome and he works for the United Nations.

E-Newsletter: *Please what can you tell us about Research and Development?*

Prof. Lucal: Well concerning Nigeria, especially the south-South, development is a very important field that should bring together different disciplines including engineering, biology, ecology, medicine, etc, because there is degradation of the environment which is affecting also the local population, so to reverse the situation, it is necessary that scientists and researchers from different discipline should come together to make joint efforts to help the country.

E-Newsletter: So what has been your observation while researching in here?

Prof. Luca: Well, it has been 20 years now that I have been working almost permanently in Nigeria. I work also in other West African countries. Here there has been a general negative effect

due to the monopolization of the oil industry on the rural and forestry activities. Over 20 years ago the country was one of the main exporters of things like cocoa but now all that is almost finished because the oil industry has monopolized everything. This has improved wealth in some areas but in general it hasn't improved the economic conditions of the people and that's a problem because they are the giant of the African economy in terms of possibilities, so we have many more chances to do much better than we are doing now.

E-Newsletter: What advice would you give in the area of research and development?

Prof. Luca: Well I think that the best thing that should be done is for the oil companies to develop inter disciplinary groups of people including scientists from medicine, economics, ecology and engineering so that they will cooperate to create a network of engineering activities that will be sustainable on the environmental point of view so that their activities will impact minimally on the environment to preserve the natural resources which are essential to the people especially in the rural areas.

Several events prepared for the executive council took place during the first days of the week:
