vious ideas. Tapping into other people's knowledge is a smart way to avoid the mistakes that could be made and learning the skills without having to go through the full learning curve/ process. Internships are a great way to improve chances of the young engineer to become a successful entrepreneur.

Richard: Entrepreneurs who start with little capital are usually more successful than those who started with a lot of capital. Little capital creates great hunger. Starting small is not an evidence of doubt but a proof of good planning. Lao Tzu said, 'A journey of a thousand miles must begin with a single step". Entrepreneurship requires planning and hard work. In the words of Mark Twain, "twenty years from now, you will be more disappointed by the things you didn't do than by the ones you did do.
