Since we understand it better why don't we make and create jobs out of these opportunities and for Nigeria espegraduate unemployment/youth unemployment is high. If we don't end up so well. don't have the manufacturing industries we cannot provide enough jobs. Why don't we try and create new jobs out of E-Newsletter: Thank you sir. the digital/internet space and that's why computer entrepreneurship is very keen so that we can create employment and empower ourselves.

E-Newsletter: *Talking about empowerment, does it require* any type of capital? How can they start up if they want to?

Opeyemi: I think when you want to start up it's about starting up with what you have, I personally started my business with nothing because it helps me to stay true to the basics of exactly how a business should start. A business should start with you having a hypothesis about the fact that something is possible and achieving it using the minimum possible ways to find out whether that opportunity is a really valid opportunity. The technologists call it minimum value product where you put the least effort or resources required to build the smallest prototype to validate the fact that the opportunity is really there. That way you can take that small prototype to an investor who may be interested.
