Apart from these the average youth in our region is only worried about how he is going to feed and maybe buy a small car for himself to impress his peers. So the youth participation in ICT in Nigeria is not encouraging and we have to change that. World leading brands such as Microsoft, Google, Facebook and Apple have been noted to employ individuals who are within the ages20 - 35 because they believe that these are the most productive and passionate years of one's life, his youthful days where he is most creative, youths have to get more involved in the ICT industry.

Onomor: In order to be able to change we have to know ex-

actly what the problems are to begin with. The primary cause of this is that there is not enough infrastructure to support the ICT sector in our region. Take examples of countries like the US and UK, the government have high participation in the ICT industry thereby providing some of the basic needs that can allow the ICT industry to thrive. Let's take a simple case study of a software developer, his only raw materials are power and internet connectivity, here in our country these are luxury. Having steady electricity supply is only what the wealthy can afford. What about internet connectivity? how many people can afford a steady internet connection? The absence of the basic raw materials for the ICT industry to thrive in our country is reducing the zeal of the youths to go into it when there are seemingly less stressful ways to be successful. Even the exceptions I noted earlier are finding it difficult but somehow they have found ways to surmount these challenges. Take for instance, in the US alone, there are over 1,240 web hosting companies, while here, we can only boast of 7 that are reliable. Why? Power. To run a successful web hosting company you need constant electricity supply. In order to change this, private firms have to start investing into the ICT industry and creativity is the lifeblood of the ICT industry.
