Interview with Engr. Kunle Ogunbayo, President Association of Consulting Engineers Nigeria (ACEN)

Engr. Kunle Ogunbayo attended University of Lagos and graduated in 1973. He worked in the television sector until 1978 and then went into consultancy. He has been in consultancy since 1978. He is ACEN President.

E-Newsletter: The theme for this year's conference is "Engineering is **Development** A Multi-Dimensional Framework for National Development." Why did ACEN choose this theme for this year's conference?

Engr. Kunle Ogunbayo: Well, there are two reasons that just happened to coincide. One was that sometime last year, we launched a book that was written by the immediate past president of ACEN, E-Newsletter: Thank you very much sir for granting us audience. Engr. Bayo Adeola. It was called Engineering is Development; and also, this year happens to be the fiftieth anniversary of our nation, so we thought as Engineers, where have we been? Where should we be? What should we do? If we look at the history of our nation, as engineers we have made a lot of contributions, but we have not done as good as we should. So what we said was that let us look at how engineering can be used to develop every nation; and then we went back in history, and we saw that every nation that has neglected engineering has not done as well as it should be, but those nations that looked at engineering the way it should be looked at, have done very well. The Chinese leadership out of thirteen of them, nine are engineers and they are doing very well. In a survey that was done in the UK, it was said that the second most influential Briton throughout the last century was a man called Brunel. He was an engineer. We said to ourselves we as engineers let's get down together, let's look at engineering, how it can move forward, but also realizing that we need other parts of the economy of the nation to aid this development; that is why it is called multi-dimensional.

E-Newsletter: Thank you very much. Sir, the last question is; what do you have to tell our readers, Nigerians and the Engineering family about actualizing development through engineering?

Engr. Kunle Ogunbayo: One of the things that we hope to do with this conference is to come up with a framework. A framework that will give guidelines on how engineering can be used; having done that, we will then begin to implement those guidelines. We don't just do it and issue a communiqué. We will issue a communiqué. That communiqué will give details of what we want to do and how we are going to do it, and then we will begin implementation. One of the things that should come out of this conference immediately like I said, is that we need to strengthen our process of advocacy; we need to get closer to the government. That is one of the things we are going to be doing straight up.

The conference was well attended by consulting engineers, practicing engineers, barristers, architects, non-engineers and the international community. Several papers were presented by seasoned professionals.


